NEC History



1981-82: ECAC Metro Conference formed as a basketball-only Conference. Frank Szymanski named Executive Director. Charter members: University of Baltimore, Fairleigh Dickinson University, Long Island University, Loyola College, Marist College, Robert Morris College, St. Francis (NY) College, St. Francis (PA) College, Siena College, Towson State University, Wagner College.

1982-83: Towson State University leaves the Conference for the East Coast Conference. Monmouth College announces in May, 1983 it will join the Conference for the 1985-86 season.

1983-84: University of Baltimore drops athletics and leaves the Conference.

1985-86: Monmouth College joins the Conference. Men's soccer, golf and tennis are added as championship sports with soccer receiving an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Men's basketball player Terrance Bailey of Wagner College leads the nation in scoring with 854 points and a 29.4 ppg. average.

1986-87: Baseball, women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and softball are added as championship sports.

1987-88: Chris Monasch named first full-time Commissioner on June 16, 1987, replacing executive director Frank Szymanski. George Drozin named first full-time Assistant Commissioner for public relations. Edgar Cartotto hired as first full-time Supervisor of men's and women's basketball officials. Conference gains first permanent headquarters at Fairleigh Dickinson University's Rutherford campus. Conference men's basketball final shown live by ESPN for the first time. Men's indoor track, women's tennis and volleyball are added as championship sports. Rik Smits of Marist College is the second overall pick of the 1988 NBA draft by the Indiana Pacers. Mount St. Mary's College's Peter Rono wins 1988 Olympic 1,500-meter gold medal.

1988-89: ECAC Metro renamed Northeast Conference on August 1, 1988, after gaining autonomy from the ECAC. Bob Steitz named first full-time Associate Commissioner for compliance and championships on August 1, 1988. Ray Cella named Assistant Commissioner for communications on August 1, 1988. League office moves to Woodbridge, NJ in September, 1988. Loyola College announces in September 1988 it will leave the Conference at the end of the season. Mount St. Mary's College announces on December 8, 1988, it will join the Conference for the 1990-91 season. The University of Akron announces on February 22, 1989 it will join the Conference for the 1990-91 season. Conference institutes first Academic Awards program. The University of Akron withdraws from the Conference in June, 1989 for the Association of Mid-Continent Universities. Dave Calloway of Monmouth College leads the nation in three-point field goal percentage at .585 (48-of-82).

1989-90: Mount St. Mary's College joins the Conference. Loyola College leaves the Conference for the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. Men's soccer post-season tournament is added. Women's volleyball is discontinued as a championship sport, effective after the 1989 championship, due to lack of participation on the part of the membership. On October 18, 1989, the Conference files a breach of contract lawsuit against the University of Akron. Marist College announces on February 6, 1990, that it will not leave the Conference for the East Coast Conference as indicated in December 1988. Men's and women's outdoor track and women's indoor track added as championship sports for the 1990-91 season. Men's soccer loses automatic bid. Long Island University softball player Natalie Jufer picked as a GTE Academic All-American.

1990-91: David Siroty named Assistant Commissioner for public relations on October 9, 1990 replacing Ray Cella who left for the Atlantic 10 Conference. Mike Marcil named Associate Commissioner for compliance and championships on December 19, 1990 replacing Bob Steitz who left for the Atlantic 10 Conference. Rik Smits, formerly of Marist College, named men's basketball Player of the Decade. The 1986-87 Marist Red Foxes named NEC Team of the Decade. Mount St. Mary's head coach Jim Phelan nominated for the Basketball Hall of Fame. St. Francis (PA) men's basketball player Mike Iuzzolino named GTE Academic All-American of the Year. Rider College announces on May 17, 1991 it will join the Conference for the 1992-93 season. Long Island University softball player Natalie Jufer picked as a GTE Academic All-American. Monmouth College men's basketball player Alex Blackwell becomes the first Conference player to ever appear on a United States men's basketball national team. He won a gold medal at the World University Games. The Ohio Court of Claims in Columbus, OH sides with Northeast Conference in breach of contract dispute with University of Akron. Monmouth College president Dr. Samuel H. Magill named to the NCAA President's Commission.

1991-92: The Ohio Court of Claims in Columbus, OH approves on September 23, 1991 a monetary settlement on the damage portion of the Northeast Conference's dispute with the University of Akron. Northeast Conference men's basketball players write team previews for Conference's men's basketball media guide. Monmouth College men's basketball team participates in Pre-Season NIT. Commissioner Chris Monasch is selected to the NCAA Council for a four-year term on January 14, 1992. Steve Hurlbut named Associate Commissioner of compliance and championships on February 6, 1992 replacing Mike Marcil who left for the NCAA. Denise Gormley is promoted on May 5, 1992 to full-time status as Assistant for Public Relations, Championships and Compliance. Mount St. Mary's College men's basketball coach Jim Phelan nominated for a second time to the Basketball Hall of Fame. Fairleigh Dickinson University sprinter Sharlene Milwood and Mount St. Mary's College decathlete Rob Pendergist compete in the United States Olympic Team Track and Field Trials.

1992-93: Rider College begins membership in the Northeast Conference. Baseball post-season tournament is added. Women's volleyball returns as a championship sport. Wagner College men's basketball team participates in Pre-Season NIT. Mount St. Mary's College men's basketball head coach Jim Phelan becomes eighth coach in college basketball history to win 700 career games on January 28, 1993. Rider College beats Wagner College in men's basketball tournament final on ESPN behind Darrick Suber's last-second shot. Wagner College's baseball player Jack Scholz named to GTE Academic All-American team. Long Island softball player Lesley Renninger named to GTE Academic All-American team. Fairleigh Dickinson University hurdler Wagner Marseille and Mount St. Mary's College decathlete Jim Stevenson earn track and field All-American status.

NEC History



1993-94: Women's volleyball is contested with in-season divisional competition for the first time. Women's basketball champion granted automatic bid to NCAA Tournament. Women's basketball tournament expanded to include all 10 teams. Men's soccer regains automatic bid to NCAA Tournament. NEC baseball and softball champions gain access to NCAA Tournament through play-in series. Mount St. Mary's women's basketball becomes first Conference women's team to participate in NCAA Tournament. Women's soccer selected on April 7, 1994 to become Conference's 16th championship sport for the 1995 season. Mount St. Mary's College's Rob Pendergast named All-American in decathlon. Marist College men's basketball player Izett Buchanan shares New York Metropolitan Area Writer's Association Haggerty Award. Rider College men's basketball player Charles Smith becomes first conference men's basketball player to participate in United States Olympic Festival. Fairleigh Dickinson University 110-meter hurdler Wagner Marseille is a quarterfinalist in the World Championships. Rider College 400-meter hurdler Jose Lopez earns All-American status.

1994-95: Rider College president Dr. J. Barton Luedeke appointed to the NCAA President's Commission. Men's soccer loses automatic bid to NCAA Tournament and is now involved in play-in game for qualification. Women's volleyball is contested with full, round-robin competition for the first time. Women's volleyball champion gains access to NCAA Tournament through play-in match. Softball begins full round-robin regular-season play. Rider College's women's volleyball team becomes first non-basketball Conference women's team to compete in an NCAA Tournament. Conference now awards Coach of the Year honors in every sport. Supervisor of Officials Edgar Cartotto honored with Pre-Season NIT Officials Award. Robert Morris College soccer coach John Kowalski takes a leave of absence to coach United States under-20 national team. Mount St. Mary's College becomes first school to win both men's and women's basketball titles in the same season. Mount St. Mary's College women's basketball player Susie Rowlyk wins NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship. She defers to play professionally in Germany. Long Island University men's basketball player Joe Griffin wins New York Metropolitan Area Writer's Association Haggerty Award. Marist College baseball player Mark Barron becomes first to win Player of the Year and Pitcher of the Year honors in the same season. Rider University baseball player Jason Koehler named to GTE Academic All-American team. Monmouth and Rider gain University status. Marist College and Rider University announce on June 26, 1995 they will leave the Conference for the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference for the 1997-98 season.

1995-96: Associate Commissioner Steve Hurlbut is appointed to NCAA Track and Field Committee and USOC/NCAA Task Force subcommittee. League begins new format for All-Academic Team whereby following the fall, winter and spring seasons, each institution selects up to five men and women with cumulative 3.0 GPA. Women's soccer commences season as 16th championship sport. Football, to begin in 1997 as NEC's 17th sport, is introduced at Giants Stadium press conference on October 31. Central Connecticut State University is added as the NEC's first associate member for football and women's soccer. Mount St. Mary's College wins NEC-record seventh-straight women's tennis title. Mount St. Mary's College's Bernard Kitur finishes 35th in NCAA Cross Country Championship. Men's basketball celebrates its 15th season and women's basketball celebrates its 10th anniversary. Monmouth University and St. Francis (PA) College win men's and women's NEC basketball tournament titles, respectively, for the first time. Marist College and Mount St. Mary's College receive NIT bids, giving the NEC three teams in men's basketball post-season play for the first time. Mount St. Mary's College finished men's basketball regular-season with conference-record 16 wins. Mount St. Mary's College senior guard Chris McGuthrie named honorable-mention UPI All-American. Fairleigh Dickinson University's Shane DeGannes competed in the 800-meters at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship. Fairleigh Dickinson University's Sharline White named All-American triple jumper at NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship. Marist College wins NEC softball title, the school's first women's NEC title. Marist College's Michele Hudson becomes first softball player to win league's Player and Pitcher of Year honors in the same season. Fairleigh Dickinson's Sharline White competes at NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship. Mount St. Mary's sets league-record with 110 points in Commissioner's Cup. Monmouth wins men's Commissioner's Cup and Mount St. Mary's wins women's Commissioner's Cup, the first time those awards are formally presented. University of Maryland Baltimore County accepts invitation to join NEC for 1998-99 academic year on June 19...Former Fairleigh Dickinson star Wagner Marseille represented Haiti in the 1996 Summer Olympics in the 110-meter hurdles...Fairleigh Dickinson's Lance Gittens and Mount St. Mary's Cliff Wong ran for Guyana in the 400-hurdles at the 1996 Summer Olympics...Mount St. Mary's Jessica Totaro ran for the United States in the 1500-meters at the 1996 World Junior Championships in Sydney, Australia...Long Island's Lou Deman signs a contract with the St. Louis Cardinals and is assigned to Class A affiliate New Jersey Cardinals of the New York-Penn league.

1996-97: League members vote in fall to add Central Connecticut State (1997), Quinnipiac (1998), UMBC (1998) and Sacred Heart (1999). Former Commissioner Chris Monasch leaves conference after 10 years to take a similar position at the America East Conference. Former Assistant Commissioner David Sirotty leaves office for Comcast Cable Network. League votes to add women's lacrosse as an NEC championship sport in the spring of 1998. NEC football completed its first season of play. Robert Morris wins the inaugural title, and wins the ECAC-Division I-AA non-scholarship bowl game. NEC promotes Denise Gormley to Assistant Commissioner, hires Kate Mulligan as Assistant Commissioner in February. Conference office moves to Piscataway, NJ. St. Francis (PA) women's basketball wins the NEC Championship for the second-straight season, and earns a bid to their second-straight NCAA Tournament. Long Island's Charles Jones leads the nation in scoring, averaging 30.1 points per game. LIU wins its first NEC men's basketball title since 1984. Long Island's basketball team becomes the first NEC team to lead the nation in scoring. LIU head coach Ray Haskins is honored as the New York Metropolitan Coach of the Year at the Haggarty Dinner, while Charles Jones is honored as the Haggarty Award-winner, as the Metropolitan area's top player. Mount St. Mary's senior women's basketball player Amy Langville is named GTE Academic All-American. NEC presidents hire John Iamarino, formerly of the Sun Belt Conference, as the league's new Commissioner on April 7, 1997. Rider wins the NEC softball tournament, and defeats Boston University in the NCAA Play-In series. Rider earns league's first ever bid to the NCAA's. Marist captures first NEC baseball title and defeats Siena in the NCAA Play-In to advance to the NCAA Tournament. Mount St. Mary's Daniel Kinyua earns All-America status with his seventh place finish in the 1500 meters at the NCAA outdoor championships. NEC members vote at spring meetings to add women's swimming and golf as championship sports in 1998-99. Marist and Rider leave the NEC in June to join the MAAC. Mount St. Mary's wins the 1997 Commissioner's Cup for the third-straight year. NEC introduces new logo.

1997-98: Central Connecticut State begins first year as full member of the NEC...UMBC becomes associate member to the NEC in the sport of women's lacrosse...NEC announces that Stony Brook and Albany will join the NEC football league in 1999...Robert Morris wins second consecutive NEC title and ECAC-IFC Bowl Game...UMBC wins first-ever women's lacrosse championship...MSG Network and its affiliates televised 13 NEC basketball games, the largest television package in the history of the league...NEC basketball tournaments move to single site for quarterfinals and semifinals...St. Francis (PA) hosts the women's tournament and Central Conn. St. hosts the men's tournament...The women's basketball championship game is televised live for the first time in NEC history...St. Francis (PA) three-peats as NEC Champions...Charles Jones of Long Island becomes just the 7th player in NCAA history to lead the nation in scoring for two-straight years...NEC sends two teams to the postseason in basketball...FDU plays in the NCAA tournament, LIU plays in the NIT...FDU's Elijah Allen scored 43 points in FDU's first round loss to UConn, the best single game performance in the 1998 NCAA Tournament...Monmouth wins rain delayed NEC Baseball Championship and goes on to defeat Navy in the NCAA Play-In. The Hawks advanced to their first NCAA Baseball Championship...Monmouth wins its first NEC Commissioners' Cup...NEC announces the addition of field hockey as a championship sport effective fall of 1998...Former Associate Commissioner Steve Hurlbut leaves the NEC to take the Athletic Director position at Fairleigh Dickinson...Former Assistant Commissioners Denise Gormley and Kate Mulligan resign to pursue other interests...Ron Ratner named Assistant Director for Communications and Championships in July, 1998...Keith Grant named Assistant Commissioner for Compliance and Championships in August, 1998.

1998-99: UMBC and Quinnipiac begin first year as full members in the NEC...Women's field hockey, women's golf, and women's swimming are added to bring total of NEC sports sponsorships to 21...Quinnipiac and associate member Sacred Heart share first-ever field hockey title...St. Francis (PA) wins first-ever women's golf championship...UMBC wins first-ever women's swimming championship...NEC receives automatic bids to the NCAA tournament in women's volleyball, men's and women's tennis, baseball and softball for the first time...Sacred Heart becomes an associate member in the sports of women's field hockey, football, women's lacrosse and women's swimming...Monmouth and Robert Morris are co-champions in football...NEC basketball tournament moves to single site for both men and women and is hosted at Wagner's new Spiro Sports Center...MSG Network and its affiliates televised 12 NEC basketball games - 10 regular season games, a men's semifinal tournament game, and the women's championship game...ESPN televised the men's basketball championship for the 13th straight year...Mount St. Mary's claims the men's basketball championship as head coach Jim Phelan records his 800th career win in the title game...St. Francis (PA) wins its 4th consecutive women's basketball tournament...NEC announces Neutrogena as the first title sponsor of the basketball tournament...NEC Radio Roundup is done for first time...NEC announces 2000 basketball tournament will be played at a neutral site, Mercer County Arena in Trenton, NJ...Monica Logan of UMBC leads the nation in rebounding averaging 13.5 rebounds per game...Ray Minlend of St. Francis (NY) finishes the season second in the nation in scoring...Men's and women's tennis championship is switched to a team-flighted format...UMBC takes home the women's title for the first time, while Fairleigh Dickinson wins its fourth straight title in men's tennis...Long Island's softball team becomes the league's first-ever women's team in any sport to win an NCAA tournament contest when they defeated Manhattan 4-3...Monmouth wins the baseball title and appears in the NCAA tourney for the 2nd straight year...UMBC wins the Commissioner's Cup, which is the first time a member school wins the cup in its inaugural year in the league...St. Francis (PA) features four GTE Academic All-Americans who participated in NEC sponsored sports: Matt Farabaugh (first team, football), Matt Hartman (third team, outdoor track), Rob Krimmel (third team, basketball) and Kate Wallace (first team, outdoor track)...Ron Ratner promoted to Assistant Commissioner for Public Relations...Donna Poyant named Assistant Director of Communications in January, 1999 and Andrew Alia named Assistant Director of Operations in June, 1999.

1999-2000: Sacred Heart begins first year as full member in the NEC...NEC receives first-ever automatic bid to NCAA Tournament in men's golf...NEC receives automatic bids for NCAA Tournaments in 8 sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball) and participates in three more tournaments via play-ins (men's and women's soccer) and qualifying time (men's outdoor track) for a total of 11 NCAA Tournament appearances...UMBC's men's soccer team enjoyed a top-20 national ranking and took the #1 team in the country, Duke, to overtime before falling 4-3 in the NCAA Tournament...LIU's women's soccer team, in just the program's 3rd year of existence, defeated Southwest Texas, 1-0, in a play-in game to advance to the NCAA Tournament...Stephen Ondieki of FDU finished 9th in the 10K at the NCAA men's outdoor track and field championships...NEC men's basketball champion, CCSU, had an outstanding season and finished the year by taking highly ranked Iowa State to the wire before bowing out in the first round of the NCAA's...St. Francis (PA)'s women's basketball team claimed its record setting 5th consecutive NEC Tournament title and entered the NCAA Tournament for the 5th year in a row with its highest seed at #14...Robert Morris claimed its 4th consecutive championship in football and finished the season as the nation's top ranked I-AA non-scholarship program...Wagner earned its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in any sport when they claimed the NEC baseball championship...The NEC continued to be featured for the third year as part of a 12 game basketball television package on MSG Network. Nine men's regular season games, two men's quarterfinal contests and the women's championship game were on MSG and their affiliates...ESPN televised the men's title game for the 14th consecutive season...The NEC introduced an Internet Basketball Game of the Week on Yahoo!Broadcast and also broadcasted three tournament games live on the internet...760 student-athletes earned NEC Academic Honor Roll accolades...St. Francis (PA)'s Kate Wallace (Cross Country & Track), Matt Hartman (Track) and Rob Krimmel (Basketball) were all tabbed GTE Academic All-Americans for the second year in a row...UMBC's Jen Ecker (Cross Country) and Oscar Lopez (Tennis) were also GTE Academic All-Americans...St. Francis (PA)'s standout women's basketball player, Jess Zinobile, became the NEC's all-time scoring and rebounding leader. Zinobile also became the first-ever NEC player to be drafted by the WNBA...The NEC played it's men's and women's basketball tournament at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton, NJ, marking the first time the tournament took place at a neutral site...A new football financial aid package was adopted, to take effect beginning in the 2000 season...UMBC won its second consecutive Commissioner's Cup and claimed 5 of the conference's NCAA tournament appearances in men's golf, men's soccer, softball and men's and women's tennis.

2000-01: NEC receives first-ever NCAA automatic bids in women's golf and women's lacrosse...NEC receives automatic bids for NCAA Tournaments in nine team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball) and participates in the NCAA Tournament in women's soccer via a play-in win...FDU's Stephen Ondieki earned All-American honors, finishing second at the NCAA Cross Country Championships...Ondieki again named All-American after finishing sixth in the 5K at the NCAA Men's Indoor Track & Field Championships. Monmouth's Jon Kalnas also named All-American after placing 11th in the shot put at the NCAA Indoor Championships...UMBC's Cleopatra Borel finished eighth in the shot put at the NCAA Women's Indoor Track & Field Championships to become the Retrievers first-ever female track & field All-American...Borel named All-American again in the spring after finishing sixth at the NCAA Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships...The NEC sends four men's athletes, its most-ever in one season, to compete at the NCAA Men's Outdoor Track & Field Championships. FDU's Tyrone Johnson (long jump), Monmouth's Jon Kalnas (shot put) and Joe Madden (hammer) and St. Francis (PA)'s Brian Sell (10K) all competed, while Madden came home an All-American after placing 12th in the hammer...Monmouth outfielder Jason Law selected first team ABCA/Rawlings All-American and Louisville Slugger All-American...Robert Morris claimed its fifth consecutive NEC football championship and ended the season as the nation's top ranked Div. I-AA mid-major program...St. John's joined the NEC as an associate member in football...The ECAC Bowl was resurrected with the NEC and MAAC football champions to square off beginning in the fall of 2001...NEC added a football "Game of the Week" to its Yahoo! Broadcast internet radio package, while continuing its basketball internet "Game of the Week" coverage...NEC continued its television package with basketball games being aired on Madison Square Garden Network, Fox Sports-New York, Fox Sports-Pittsburgh and Home Team Sports...St. Francis (PA) College changed its name to St. Francis University and unveiled new logo...NEC celebrated 20th Anniversary with selection of 20th Anniversary All-Time Basketball Teams and 20th Anniversary All-Sport Teams...903 student-athletes earned NEC Academic Honor Roll accolades...St. Francis (NY) pitcher Jaron Fartella was selected by the Colorado Rockies in the seventh round of the MLB draft...UMBC won its third consecutive Commissioner's Cup in as many tries...Hired Matt DeSantis as Director of Marketing in September, 2000...Hired Alex Ivahnenko as coordinator of soccer officials...Hired Ed Meier as coordinator of women's basketball officials...Assistant Commissioner Keith Grant resigned in June to accept Assistant AD position at Rutgers University...Extended contract of Commissioner John Iamarino through 2003-04...Hired Corrinne Wright as Assistant Commissioner in July, 2001 to replace Grant.

2001-02: The NEC received automatic bids for NCAA Tournaments in 11 team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball) and participated in the NCAA Softball Tournament via a play-in series win...Sacred Heart won its first-ever NEC football championship and capped off an undefeated season (11-0) with a 31-15 victory over Duquesne in the ECAC Football Classic. SHU ended the year ranked #1 in the Sports Network's inaugural I-AA Mid-Major poll...Fairleigh Dickinson captured its second straight NEC men's soccer title. The Knights then proceeded to beat Boston College, Princeton and Seton Hall in the NCAA Tournament to advance to the Elite Eight, before falling to eventual national champion North Carolina, 3-2, in triple overtime. FDU ended the season ranked #11 in the country by the NSCAA...St. Francis (PA) claimed the unofficial 'Triple Crown' of men's track for a second consecutive year by taking home championships in cross country, indoor track & field and outdoor track & field...SFPA's Kevin Doyle and FDU's Erick Too both competed at the NCAA Cross Country Championships...CCSU men's basketball won an NEC record 19 straight games and also established league marks for overall (27) and conference (19) wins...The NEC placed two men's basketball teams in the postseason for the first time since 1998. CCSU won the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, while Wagner received an NIT bid...CCSU men's basketball competed in the preseason NIT and was featured on an ESPN Outside the Lines documentary following its NEC title win...UMBC's Cleopatra Borel became the first NEC athlete to ever win a national title when she claimed the shot put crown at the NCAA Women's Indoor Track & Field Championships...Monmouth's Jon Kalnas was a two-time All-American, earning honors in both the indoor (5th) and outdoor (4th) shot put...Long Island's Richard James competed at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships in the 400 meters...UMBC's Lindsey Prather and CCSU's Tammie Repass became the first NEC athletes to compete at the NCAA Women's Swimming & Diving Championships...UMBC became just the second women's team in league history to win a NCAA Tournament game when it defeated Liberty in softball...Sacred Heart outfielder Matt Lemanczyk was drafted in the 10th round by the St. Louis Cardinals...UMBC ran its string to seven straight NEC tennis titles (four women, three men) over the last four years...The NEC Baseball Tournament was shifted to FirstEnergy Park in Lakewood, NJ...The NEC produced the largest television package in league history, broadcasting over 20 men's and women's games on Madison Square Garden Network, Fox Sports-New York, Fox Sports-Pittsburgh, Comcast Sports Net and Cablevision...Sacred Heart's DeVeren Johnson became the first NEC football player to be picked in the NFL draft when the Dallas Cowboys selected him in the 6th round...Robert Morris College changed its name to Robert Morris University...982 student-athletes earned NEC Academic Honor Roll accolades...SFPA's Kristen Arnott earned third team Verizon Academic All-American honors in women's soccer, while UMBC's Kathryn Wheatley (tennis) and Cleopatra Borel (indoor track & field) also were named third team Academic All-Americans...St. Francis (PA) ranks in the top 10 nationally in Academic All-Americans over the last four years with ten...Attendance at the NEC Basketball Tournament was up 78% over the 2001 event due in part to the decision to return to campus sites...CCSU's Corsley Edwards was chosen by the Sacramento Kings with the 58th and final pick of the 2002 NBA Draft, marking the first time since 1991 that an NEC player had been drafted...UMBC took home its fourth Commissioner's Cup in as many years...Associate football member St. John's departed the league...FDU assistant soccer coach Eihan Zohn captured the \$1,000,000 prize money on "Survivor Africa"...The NEC retained Positive Impact, a sports and entertainment group, to assist the conference with marketing and sponsorship initiatives...Conference office moved to Somerset, NJ...Ron Ratner was promoted to Associate Commissioner and Donna Poyant and Andrew Alia were elevated to Assistant Commissioner.

2002-03: The NEC received NCAA Tournament automatic bids in 12 team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball), while NEC student-athletes also qualified for NCAA Championship events in men's cross country, men's indoor track & field and men's outdoor track & field...Fairleigh Dickinson captured its third straight men's soccer title and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament before losing to fourth seeded St. John's, 2-1, in double overtime...Robert Morris won its fourth consecutive NEC Volleyball Championship...St. Francis (PA)'s men's track program claimed the conference's unofficial 'Triple Crown' for a third straight year by taking home championships in cross country, indoor track & field and outdoor track & field...SFPA's Ryan Sheehan and FDU's Erick Too both competed at the NCAA Cross Country Championship...Albany defeated MAAC Champion Duquesne, 24-0, to win the ECAC Football Classic, and conclude the season as the nation's third ranked I-AA Mid-Major team...Wagner won its first-ever NEC Men's Basketball Championship, defeating St. Francis (NY) in a game which marked the first time in NCAA history that two New York City schools met with an NCAA automatic tournament berth at stake...St. Francis (PA) won its seventh women's basketball crown in eight years...UMBC's Huguens Jean (fourth in the high jump) and LIU's Richard James (eighth in the 400 meters) both earned All-American status for their respective performances at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships...CCSU pitcher Barry Hertzler was named a Louisville Slugger second team All-American, while teammate Tim D'Aquila was tabbed a third team ABCA/Rawlings All-American...Long Island lefffielder Rosette Rough was chosen as a Louisville Slugger third team Softball All-American...Albany running back Gary Jones was picked to the Associated Press All-America Football second team, while Monmouth linebacker Joe Sentipal garnered third team AP accolades. also honored as a I-AA third team All-American by the Sports Network...UMBC ran its string to nine straight NEC tennis titles (five women, four men) over the last five years...Five NEC baseball players were chosen in the 2003 Major League Baseball Draft...The NEC televised 30 basketball games - a record number for the conference - on its flagship station MSG Network, as well as regional outlets such as Fox Sports-New York, Fox Sports-Pittsburgh, Fox Sports-New England and Comcast SportsNet. As part of the package, the NEC also aired six men-women basketball doubleheaders on Cablevision systems and affiliates. ESPN broadcast the men's championship game for the 16th straight year, while MSG televised the women's title contest for the sixth season in a row...UMBC took home its fifth Commissioner's Cup in as many years...926 student-athletes earned NEC Academic Honor Roll accolades, along with one scholar-athlete award winner in each sport...Six NEC student-athletes were recognized nationally as they were named Verizon Academic All-Americans in their respective sports; Monmouth's Justin Rosato (first team - football), UMBC's Lana Khvalina (first team - tennis), Quinnipiac's Heather Wollyung (second team - volleyball), St. Francis (PA)'s Andrew Maloney (second team - track & field/cross country) and Wagner's Dedrick Dye (third team - basketball) and Carrie Walker (third team - basketball). St. Francis (PA) ranks among the top programs nationally in Academic All-Americans over the last five years with 13...UMBC departed the league to join the America East, effective July 1, 2003...Positive Impact marketing/consulting firm no longer retained, other than as a commission-based sales force...Dr. Richard Judd (CCSU) appointed President and Dr. Frank Macchiarola (SFNY) appointed Vice President of NEC...NEC Men's Basketball Coach of the Year award renamed Jim Phelan Coach of the Year award, upon Phelan's retirement in March 2003, after 49 years of coaching at Mount St. Mary's College. In honor of Phelan's historic career, March 1, 2003 was declared as National Bow-Tie Day, with NCAA coaches across the country donning bow-ties to recognize Phelan.

2003-04: The NEC received NCAA Tournament automatic bids in 12 team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball), while NEC student-athletes also qualified for NCAA Championship events in men's indoor track & field, women's swimming and men's outdoor track & field... Robert Morris won its fifth consecutive NEC Volleyball championship while St. Francis (PA) captured its fifth straight league championship in men's cross country and third consecutive NEC title in women's cross country...Fairleigh Dickinson earned its fourth successive NEC championship in men's soccer and Central Connecticut State repeated as NEC champions in women's soccer...Central Connecticut State topped Wagner, 10-3, to earn its third consecutive NEC Baseball Championship. The Blue Devils went on to lose to Florida, 12-1, and Oklahoma, 6-1, in the NCAA Tournament... Monmouth won its third NEC men's basketball title after downing CCSU, 67-55. The Hawks season ended when Mississippi State defeated Monmouth, 85-52, at the NCAA Tournament... The Red Flash fell to Purdue, 78-59, at the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament... Monmouth and Albany both claimed NEC regular season champions in football. In the ECAC Bowl Game, Monmouth fell to Duquesne, 12-10... Long Island captured its first NEC men's golf title and earned its first-ever NCAA tournament appearance, finishing 27th overall... Saint Francis (PA) won its third consecutive NEC Women's Golf Championship before finishing 21st at the NCAA East Regional... Saint Francis (PA) captured its fourth-straight NEC men's indoor track & field crown... Monmouth won its first-ever NEC Women's Indoor Track & Field title... Monmouth captured the NEC men's and women's outdoor track & field crowns... Quinnipiac swept the NEC men's and women's tennis championships... Quinnipiac won its third NEC Field Hockey Championship in the last five years, defeating top seed and tournament host Rider, 2-1. The Bobcats fell to American, 4-1, in the NCAA Play-In game... Mount St. Mary's edged Monmouth, 11-10, for the NEC Women's Lacrosse title. The Mount defeated Manhattan, 12-7, in the NCAA Play-In game before falling to Virginia, 19-2... Long Island cruised to its record eighth NEC title with a 15-7 triumph over Quinnipiac. The Blackbirds fell to Florida State, 4-0, and Florida, 4-0, at the NCAA Softball Regional... Gardner-Webb won its first-ever NEC Women's Swimming Championship.

2004-05: The NEC received NCAA Tournament automatic bids in 12 team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball), while NEC student-athletes also qualified for NCAA Championship events in men's indoor track & field, women's swimming and men's outdoor track & field... Long Island won its first ever NEC Volleyball championship, defeating five-time defending champion Robert Morris, while Quinnipiac captured the championship in men's cross country for the first time in school history... In women's cross country, St. Francis (PA) collected its fourth straight league championship, while the Central Connecticut State women's soccer team made it three in a row... Long Island won the NEC championship in men's soccer and advanced to the ECAC Tournament championship match in women's soccer... Monmouth won the Sports Network Cup, emblematic of the top mid-major program in the nation, as five conference programs finished in the final top-10 poll... Quinnipiac collected its second consecutive NEC championship in both men's and women's tennis... Robert Morris claimed its sixth NEC softball crown, while Quinnipiac captured the NEC baseball title for the first time in school history... Monmouth's Bobby Smith (5th - javelin), Long Island's Bryan Steele (6th - 400m hurdles) and St. Francis (PA)'s Ryan Sheehan (11th - 10,000m) all earned All-American status for their respective performances at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships... Mount St. Mary's outfielder Josh Vittek was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, while four NEC student-athletes were chosen in the 2005 Major League Baseball Draft... Monmouth, which took home NEC titles in men's and women's indoor track & field and men's outdoor track & field, won its second straight NEC Commissioner's Cup and fourth overall... The Hawks also earned a share of the NEC football crown, finished tied with Mount St. Mary's for first place in women's lacrosse and won the regular season men's basketball championship... 1,032 student-athletes earned NEC Academic Honor Roll accolades, along with one scholar-athlete award winner in each sport... St. Francis (PA)'s Beth Swink (women's basketball), along with Long Island's David Ledet (men's soccer), Robert Morris' Jonathan LeDonne (football) and Gardner-Webb's Taylor Simpson (women's swimming) were recognized nationally as *ESPN The Magazine* first team Academic All-Americans... Assistant Commissioner Corrinne Wright resigned in June to accept SWA position at Richard Stockton College.

2005-06: The NEC received NCAA Tournament automatic bids in 12 team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball), while NEC student-athletes also qualified for NCAA Championship events in women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track & field, women's swimming and men's and women's outdoor track & field. . . Long Island captured the NEC Volleyball Championship for the second straight season and became the first team in NEC history to win an NCAA Women's Volleyball Tournament game with a 3-0 win over Cornell. . . Central Connecticut State and Stony Brook shared the football title. . . For the first time in league history, Quinnipiac and Sacred Heart earned a share of the women's cross country title with the Bobcats' Katie Gwyther earning all All-America status after finishing 12th at the NCAA Championship. . . In men's cross country, St. Francis (PA) captured its sixth title in seven years, while the Central Connecticut State women's soccer team made it four in a row. . . Robert Morris claimed the men's soccer title, while Sacred Heart won its first-ever NEC field hockey crown. . . St. Francis (PA)'s Michael Caputo was named to the Associated Press and Sports Network I-AA All-American teams, while Monmouth's Miles Austin signed a free agent contract with the Dallas Cowboys. . . Monmouth won the NEC men's basketball championship and defeated Hampton in the NCAA Play-In game, before falling to top-seeded Villanova. . . On the women's side, Sacred Heart captured the crown and secured its first NCAA Tournament appearance, where the Pioneers fell to the eventual champion, Maryland. . . ESPN broadcast the men's championship game for the 19th straight year, while MSG televised the women's title contest for the eighth season in a row. . . Long Island won its first women's indoor track & field title, while Monmouth claimed the title on the men's side for the second consecutive season. . . Central Connecticut State's Jaime Crowley qualified for the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships in the 50 freestyle, 100 freestyle and 100 breaststroke and went on to compete in the US National Championship, along with teammate Lindsey Snyder. . . Quinnipiac captured the men's and women's tennis titles for the third straight year. . . Sacred Heart capture its first NEC baseball title, while Long Island softball claimed its third crown in four years. . . Wagner's Andrew Bailey was drafted by Oakland in the sixth round of the MLB draft. . . Monmouth won the women's lacrosse championship, while Long Island captured its first women's outdoor track & field title and Monmouth won its third straight on the men's side. . . St. Francis (PA) won both the men's and women's golf titles. . . Monmouth won its third straight and NEC Commissioner's Cup and fifth overall. . . 1,042 student-athletes earned NEC Academic Honor Roll accolades, along with one scholar-athlete award winner in each sport. . . Sacred Heart's Kibwe Trim (men's basketball), St. Francis (PA)'s Luke Palko (football), Gardner-Webb's Taylor Simpson (swimming) were named *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA first team Academic All-Americans, while Robert Morris' Ray Gensler (football), Wagner's Joy Gallagher (softball) and the Mount's Mandy Jenkins (track & field) were named to the second team and Fairleigh Dickinson's Lisa Friscioni (bowling) and Quinnipiac's Ryan Rizzo (baseball) and Katie Gwyther (track & field) were tabbed to the third team. . . The NEC celebrated its 25th anniversary, by naming a silver anniversary men's and women's basketball team and special features throughout the year. . . NEC Commissioner John Iamarino resigned in January to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. . . The NEC appointed Rachele Held as an Assistant Commissioner in July 2005.

2006-07: The NEC received NCAA Tournament automatic bids in 12 team sports (baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball), while NEC student-athletes also qualified for NCAA Championship events in men's indoor track & field, women's swimming and men's outdoor track & field. . . Monmouth won its third NEC baseball title with a 7-1 win over CCSU in the championship game held at New Britain Stadium. The Hawks lost a pair of tight games at the NCAA Baseball Regional to #5 Arizona State, 5-3, and Nebraska, 6-5. Six NEC players were selected in the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft: Ivor Hodgson & Mike Gioioso (MSM), Randy Gress (QU), Jay Monti (SHU), Evan Scribner (CCSU) and Joe DiGeronimo (WC). . . Central Connecticut State beat Sacred Heart in men's basketball, 74-70, before a nationwide audience on ESPN2 before dropping a 78-57 decision to Ohio State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The *NEC Countdown To Tipoff* basketball preview show aired on regional networks throughout the Northeast and nationally on Fox College Sports. . . In women's basketball, Robert Morris defeated Sacred Heart, 68-66, to win its first NEC crown since 1991. The Colonials went on to fall to N.C. State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, while Long Island became the first NEC school to participate in the WNIT. . . Quinnipiac captured its second NEC Cross Country title in three years. Fairleigh Dickinson's Samuel Chelanga finished 16th at the NCAA championships and was named a USTFCCCA All-American, as well as Middle Atlantic Region Athlete of the Year by the USTFCCCA. . . On the women's side, Quinnipiac claimed its second consecutive NEC Cross Country Championship. . . Associate member Lock Haven topped Sacred Heart, 7-1, to win its first NEC Field Hockey title, before dropping a 4-2 decision to Richmond in the NCAA Play-In game. . . Duquesne is announced as an NEC associate member in football beginning in 2008. CCSU's Justise Hairston, the NEC Offensive Player of the Year, and Albany's Rashad Barksdale were both chosen in the NFL Draft, the third and fourth players in NEC history to be drafted. NEC champion Monmouth competed in the postseason, hosting San Diego in the *Gridiron Classic*, live on CSTV. Justise Hairston, Robert Morris lineman Ray Gensler and Albany linebacker Colin Disch were named All-Americans. Albany and CCSU became the first NEC teams to be ranked in the Sports Network FCS Top-25 poll. . . Monmouth claimed its first NEC Men's Golf Championship with a one-stroke win over Saint Francis (PA). The Hawks went on to finish 27th in the NCAA West Regional. . . Saint Francis (PA) won the NEC Women's Golf title for the fifth time in six years with a 19-stroke victory at Hershey East Golf Course. The Red Flash came in 21st at the NCAA Central Regional. . . Monmouth took home its third consecutive NEC Men's Indoor Track title. Sacred Heart's Arman Dixon and Fairleigh Dickinson's Samuel Chelanga both received All-American honors. . . Long Island won its back-to-back NEC Women's Indoor Track Championship. . . Monmouth defeated regular season champion Mount St. Mary's, 9-8, to defend its NEC Lacrosse crown. The Hawks went on to fall to LeMoyn, 19-12, in the NCAA Play-In contest. . . Monmouth won both the men's and women's NEC Outdoor Track & Field Championships. . . Monmouth captured its second NEC Men's Soccer title with a 1-0 win over Saint Francis (PA), then dropped a 1-0 decision to St. John's in the first round of the NCAA College Cup. Monmouth's Steven Holloway was named an NSCAA/*adidas* Third Team All-American. . . Long Island downed Monmouth, 2-0, to claim its second women's soccer NEC championship. The Blackbirds fell to Texas, 4-0, in the NCAA College Cup first round play. NSCAA/*adidas* named Monmouth's Andrea Lopez a Third-Team All-Mid Atlantic Region. . . Long Island won its fourth softball NEC Championship in the last five years and tenth overall. The Blackbirds won their second NCAA Tournament game in school history with a 5-1 win over Colgate, before dropping a 4-3 and 7-3 decision to UMass at the Amherst Regional. . . Gardner-Webb won the NEC Swimming Championship for the fourth straight year. At the NCAA Championships, Gardner-Webb's Terra Wilson took sixth place and earned All-America honors in the 200 freestyle with a time of 1:45.40, becoming the NEC's first-ever All-American in the sport. . . Fairleigh Dickinson captured its first NEC men's Tennis title since 1999 with a 4-0 win over Monmouth in the championship match. The Knights fell to top-seeded Georgia, 4-0, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. . . For the fourth year in a row, top-seeded Quinnipiac captures the NEC Women's Tennis Championship with a 4-3 come-from-behind victory over Long Island in a classic match that lasted four hours and 45 minutes. The Bobcats then dropped a 4-0 decision to UCLA in the NCAA Tournament. . . Long Island won the NEC Volleyball Championship with a 3-0 triumph over Robert Morris. The Blackbirds closed out their year with a 3-0 setback to Penn State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. . . The NEC signed a three-year agreement with the America Channel. The partnership includes expanded coverage of basketball and football, along with televised championships in men's and women's soccer, volleyball, field hockey, men's and women's tennis, lacrosse, baseball and softball.

2007-08: Bryant University accepted an invitation from the Northeast Conference's Council of Presidents in October to become the NEC's 12th core member in 2012 upon completion of the five-year NCAA Division I reclassification period...Sacred Heart captured its first-ever NEC Commissioner's Cup. The Pioneers also claimed a second straight women's cup, while Monmouth took home its seventh consecutive men's cup...In a landmark decision for the league, the NEC was awarded an automatic bid into the NCAA FCS playoffs beginning in 2010 after the bracket is expanded for the first time in 21 years...The NEC televised a pair of regular season men's basketball games on ESPN2, the league's newest broadcast partner. These were the first nationally televised conference regular season games in NEC history...In partnership with the New York Times, the NEC produced a 12-page special section highlighting the NEC Basketball Tournament and other league stories in the March 2, 2008 edition of Play Magazine...NEC launched its own YouTube channel in April, entered the world of podcasting (NEC on the Run segments) and launched its own on-demand video archive (NEC Flashbacks). Through its partnership with PackNetwork, the NEC webstreamed the women's basketball, softball and baseball tournaments...NEC remains in Somerset, NJ, but moved into a larger and more modern workspace in April...The NEC inked a three-year agreement to serve as the official sponsor of the Legends Classic College Basketball Tournament, which will culminate at the state-of-the-art Prudential Center in Newark, NJ each November...Monmouth broke ground on its new Multipurpose Activity Center (MAC) in September. The 152,400 square foot facility is slated to open in 2009 and will contain a multipurpose gymnasium with 4,100 seats and a 200-meter, six-lane indoor track...In May, the NEC announced men's lacrosse as the 22nd conference sport with its inaugural season set for 2011...The NEC Student-Athlete Advisory Committee made its annual visit to Cancer Recovery Foundation in Hershey, PA in February...St. Francis (NY)'s Irma Garcia became the first Hispanic woman to serve as a Director of Athletics in the Division I ranks when she was tabbed to replace Ed Aquilone, who retired at the end of the 2006-07 season...Mount St. Mary's won its first-ever NEC baseball crown, becoming the second team in league history to win the tournament coming out of the loser's bracket. After dropping its first game, the Mount won four straight over the final two days of the tournament held in Atlantic City, NJ...Mount senior first baseman Josh Vittek was named Tournament MVP after establishing records for RBIs in a game (six) and series (twelve), and tying the tourney record with four home runs. He also set an NEC single-season mark with 20 round-trippers...Monmouth's Brad Brach (Padres) and Kyle Higgins (Rangers), along with Quinnipiac's John Delaney (Brewers) and Chris Gloor (Tigers), were chosen in the 2008 MLB Draft. The Mount's Josh Vittek, a PING! Baseball Third Team All-American designated hitter, was signed as a free agent by the Kansas City Royals...Seeded fourth, Mount St. Mary's men's basketball earned its third NEC title with a 68-55 win over Sacred Heart before nationwide audience on ESPN2 and school record crowd at the William H. Pitt Center in Fairfield, CT...Mount St. Mary's became the third NEC school to win an NCAA Tournament game by knocking off Coppin State, 69-60, in opening round action in Dayton, OH. The Mount then fell to top-ranked North Carolina in first round play in Raleigh, NC...Robert Morris senior guard Tony Lee was named NEC Player of the Year and Honorable Mention All-America...Quinnipiac senior swingman DeMario Anderson is tabbed to the *CollegiateInsider* Mid-Major All-America team...Robert Morris women's basketball stopped Long Island, 86-75, to walk away with its second straight NEC title...Robert Morris fell to Rutgers in first round of NCAA Tournament, while Quinnipiac was beat by Iona in WNIT first round action...For the third straight season, three NEC women's basketball teams (Long Island, Quinnipiac and Robert Morris) reached the 20-win mark...Robert Morris junior guard Sade Logan captured NEC Player of the Year accolades and finished the season ranked second in the country in scoring at 25.2 ppg...The NEC received \$75,000 as part of the new NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Grant Program designed to foster the growth of women's basketball on NCAA member campuses and within NCAA member conferences...Quinnipiac won its second consecutive NEC men's cross country championship behind seniors Jacob Gurzler and Keith Bushey, the meet's top two finishers...Quinnipiac, Monmouth, and Sacred Heart all earned recognition on the United States Track & Field Cross Country Association All-Academic Team list...Powered by NEC individual champion Kristin Stevens and runner-up Chelsea Bollerman, Quinnipiac won its third straight NEC women's cross country team title...The United States Track & Field Cross Country Association named Quinnipiac, Monmouth, Sacred Heart and Central Connecticut State to its All-Academic Team list...Associate member Lock Haven captured its second consecutive NEC Field Hockey Tournament crown by defeating Rider, 3-1, in the championship match...Lock Haven senior midfielder Blair Wynne was named a second team *Longstreth/NFHCA* Division I All-American...Albany captured its first conference football crown since 2003 by winning its regular season finale over CCSU in a winner-take-all game. The Great Danes went on to face Dayton in the second *Gridiron Classic*. After becoming the first NEC competitor to rush for at least 100 yards in every game of a season, Wagner senior Jason Butler earned the NEC Offensive Player of the Year award. Butler amassed the second-highest single season rushing total (1,173 yards) in league history to join senior teammate Piotr Czech as both a first team all-conference selection and NEC recordholder. A first team pick at both placekicker and punter, Czech established the league record for longest field goal with a 56-yard completion...Sacred Heart won its first NEC Men's Golf championship with a record-setting performance at the Hershey Links in May. The Pioneers finished six-over par for the event setting 18, 36, and 54-hole conference records in the process...Monmouth senior Anthony Campanile captured his second individual title by carding rounds of 70, 71, and 71 en-route to a four-under par 212...Fairleigh Dickinson claimed the NEC Women's Golf title for the first time with a two-stroke victory over Sacred Heart at the Lake Jovita Golf & Country Club in Dade City, FL...CCSU sophomore Lucie Sarochova captured NEC individual honors, firing a 13-over par 229 for an eight stroke victory...FDU's Michele Holzwarth was named 2008 NEC Golfer and Rookie of the Year after winning seven individual titles over the course of the season. She was just the second player in conference history to receive both accolades, joining teammate Eva Mayr (2007)...Sacred Heart captured its first men's indoor track championship, dethroning three-time defending champion Monmouth...SHU senior Arman Dixon, a three-time MVP (2005, 2007, 2008), earned the NEC Most Outstanding Performer award in both track and field...Dixon represented the NEC at the 2008 NCAA Indoor Championships where he posted the 11th-best 200-meter preliminary time of 21.12...In women's indoor track, Monmouth thwarted Long Island's bid for a third consecutive team title. The Hawks' latest crown was their third this decade under NEC Coach of the Year Joe Compagni...NEC Most Valuable Performer Alaina Alfano tallied 28 of Wagner's 48 team points...In perhaps the most exciting finish in women's lacrosse league history, Sacred Heart captured its first-ever NEC crown with a 15-14 win over Quinnipiac. Sophomore Carissa Hauser scored the game-winner - her fifth goal of the contest - with just three seconds left on the clock...Quinnipiac junior midfielder Tiffany Manzi was chosen NEC Player of the Year...CCSU's Alice Lee ended the season as the nation's leader in ground balls and saves per game...In men's outdoor track, Sacred Heart stifled Monmouth's quest for a fifth consecutive team title behind another MVP performance from Arman Dixon...Dixon topped the NEC meet record in the long jump, while also recording an NCAA regional qualifying mark in the event to go with the qualifying time he posted in the 200-meter dash...Monmouth's Ed Skowronski produced an NCAA regional qualifying mark with his winning throw in the hammer...Dixon was named an All-American after advancing to the semifinals of the 400 meters at the NCAA Championships. He was crowned 400 meter champion at NCAA Regionals and was also named all-region in the 200 meters...Sacred Heart captured its first ever women's outdoor track title. SHU senior Marsha Locke's performance included NCAA regional qualifying marks in the shot put and javelin, which resulted in NEC Most Valuable Performer honors...Locke earned NCAA all-region honors following a sixth place performance in the shot put at NCAA regionals...Central Connecticut State men's soccer upset regular season champion Monmouth in the semifinal round of the NEC Tournament before clinching its first-ever conference title with a 1-0 victory over Saint Francis (PA)...CCSU became the second team in league history to reach the round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament with wins over Harvard and Tulsa, and ranked 25th in the final edition of the 2007 *NCAA/adidas* Top-25 Poll. Quinnipiac's Graciano Brito was named a second team *NCAA/adidas* All-American...In women's soccer, Monmouth defeated Sacred Heart, 1-0, to win its third NEC Championship...Monmouth senior midfielder Amy Hoyer became the second straight Hawk to earn NEC Player of the Year honors. She was named third team All-Mid Atlantic region by the NSCAA and *Soccer Buzz*...In softball, Long Island won its fifth NEC Tournament in the last six years and 11th overall. The Blackbirds also captured the NEC regular season crown for the eighth time in nine seasons...Wagner junior first baseman Andrea Lazzari was voted NEC Player of the Year after leading the league in home runs and RBI...Long Island's Blaire Porter - the NEC Pitcher of the Year - was named an *Easton* Softball Second Team All-American...Monmouth junior outfielder Nichole Alvarez lead NCAA with a .480 batting average...Central Connecticut State Women's Swimming secured its second NEC title, winning 18 of the 20 events...CCSU's Lindsey Snyder, winner of three individual titles, earned 2008 NEC Outstanding Swimmer honors after setting conference records in both the 100 and 200 backstroke. Snyder was also honored as a *CollegeSwimming.com* Honorable Mention Mid-Major All-American...Two weeks after winning the NEC meet, CCSU captured its first-ever ECAC championship...Fairleigh Dickinson Men's Tennis defended its NEC crown with a 4-0 win over Quinnipiac in the championship match. The Knights earned a spot in the league recordbook with their tenth overall title...On the women's side, Quinnipiac won the NEC Championship for the fifth year in a row - the longest active streak in conference history in any sport - with a 4-2 victory over longtime rival Long Island...In women's volleyball, Long Island rolled to its fourth consecutive NEC championship with a 3-0 victory over Robert Morris in the conference title match...LIU senior outside hitter Shelby Heggie was named NEC Player of the Year and NEC Tournament MVP. She ended the season as the league leader in total kills...Seven NEC student-athletes earned *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America accolades: Saint Francis (PA) runner Ian Butcher was picked to the first team. CCSU football player Ryne Nutt, a two-time honoree, Saint Francis (PA) men's soccer player Bryce Luetzen and Wagner swimmer Alexandra Tomlinson were chosen to the second team. Long Island softball player Jessie DePippo, FDU baseball player Matt Maher and Saint Francis (PA) field hockey player Erin Reifsteck earned third team honors.

NEC History



2008-09: Upon completion of its 28th season, the Northeast Conference (NEC) saw Sacred Heart capture its second straight Commissioner's Cup, which was newly renamed in honor of Commissioner Brenda Weare, who passed away in June after a long battle with a rare form of cancer. The Pioneers established a new league record with 244.07 points, while also earning their third straight women's Commissioner's Cup (with a record of 140.85 points) and captured the school's first ever men's Cup (103.22 points) ... In its inaugural season in the NEC, women's bowling exploded onto the national scene as NEC champion Fairleigh Dickinson (reached second), Sacred Heart (sixth), Kutztown (eighth) and St. Francis (NY) (19th) were all ranked in the National Tenpin Coaches Association (NTCA). The Knights reached the NCAA semifinals, marking the deepest run into the NCAA Tournament by any team in the history of the league ... In a landmark year for men's soccer, NEC teams posted the best non-conference winning percentage in the sport since 1987 with a record six teams ending above .500. FDU won its sixth NEC men's soccer title by a score of 7-2 as the seven goals established a new NEC tournament record... Albany became the first NEC football team to win the Gridiron Classic, defeating Jacksonville 28-0. Monmouth tight end John Nalbome joined the NFL ranks when he was drafted by the Miami Dolphins in the 5th round ... The NEC is now just one year away from gaining automatic access to the Division I Football Championship. Beginning in 2010, the playoff bracket will be expanded for the first time in 21 years ... Closing out the season with 12 straight wins, third-seeded Sacred Heart made its first postseason appearance and won its first ever NEC Softball title. The Pioneers also recorded the program's first NCAA Tournament win in its Division I history by topping Cornell 3-1. Earlier in the season, perennial softball powerhouse Long Island knocked off #12 Northwestern, Cal-Fullerton, UNLV and Boston University ... Robert Morris won its record sixth NEC men's basketball championship as Dallas Green drained a short jumper with 2.5 seconds to play. Aired on ESPN2, the 48-46 victory over Mount St. Mary's reached a national audience that more than tripled over the course of the contest. The Colonials' 50 wins under Mike Rice over the past two seasons is the most over a two-year stretch in league history ... Sacred Heart captured its second NEC women's basketball crown and finished its regular season a perfect 18-0 to become the third team in conference annals to go undefeated in league play. Following a 14-game improvement, CCSU women's basketball made its first-ever postseason appearance, competing in the WNIT against Boston University ... Long Island women's tennis finally broke through and defeated Quinnipiac in the sixth straight championship match between the two programs. The Bobcats had won all five of the previous title tilts until the Blackbirds - led by junior Selma Babic, the NEC Player of the Year - earned the 4-1 victory in West Windsor, NJ. Babic went on to battle Cal's Jana Juricova, the 11th ranked player in the nation ... St. Francis (NY) men's tennis standout Jindrich Chaloupka vaulted into the ITA national rankings, reaching as high as 106th in March. He was named NEC Player of the Year and went a perfect 17-0 against conference opponents and 38-6 overall to finish his career. Sacred Heart men's tennis won the NEC tournament for the first time ... Central Connecticut State's Eric Haverchuk became the first individual in NEC history to earn a bid to the NCAA Championships after being automatically placed into the NCAA Regional field following a victory at the NEC Championship in May. Sacred Heart captured the men's golf team title ... Quinnipiac women's cross country won its fourth consecutive NEC title, while the men won its third straight ... Lock Haven, which earned its third straight NEC field hockey title, had senior Blaire Wynne become the league's only three-time NEC Player of the Year ... Former Wagner pitching ace and 2006 graduate Andrew Bailey reached the major leagues for the Oakland A's and was a candidate for Rookie of the Month for April ... Five NEC baseball players were taken in the MLB Draft: LIU's James Jones (Mariners, 4th round), MU's Ryan Buch (White Sox, 8th) and Brad Brach (Indians, 10th), QU's Chris Gloor (Giants, 17th) and WC's Kyle Morrison (Nationals, 32nd) ... Wagner baseball captured its first-ever regular season crown and coach Joe Litterio was named NEC Coach of the Year. Monmouth baseball won the tournament title ... In its first season among Division I competition, Bryant University excelled in a number of sports. The Bulldog baseball team finished the year with a 32-22 record, including wins over Boston College, Virginia Tech, Richmond and James Madison. The football team finished 7-4 and men's tennis ended the year 9-9. Competing unattached, Bryant also finished second at the NEC Men's Golf Championship in May. Bryant will become a core member of the conference in 2012 upon completion of the five-year NCAA Division I reclassification period ... FDU repeated as the women's golf champions as Knights' sophomore Michele Holzwarth earned the individual title ... SFPA won the NEC men's indoor track and field championship for the first time since 2004, while the Monmouth won the indoor title on the women's side ... SHU collected its second straight women's lacrosse crown ... Monmouth took home the outdoor track and field titles on both the men's and women's side ... CCSU won its seventh NEC women's soccer championship, while LIU's Ariana Calderon became the fourth player in league annals to be named the NEC Rookie and Player of the Year ... CCSU won the NEC women's swimming and diving championship in the second closest finish in meet history in February ... Long Island took home its fifth straight NEC volleyball crown, marking the longest active streak in the conference in any sport ... Men's lacrosse will debut as the NEC's 23rd sport in either 2010 or 2011 ... The NEC received one of only 17 grants nationwide as part of the newly designed NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Grant Program. A new league record was set for women's basketball attendance, which increased over 20 percent from last season. As part of the program, the NEC partnered with the Boys & Girls Clubs and other youth-based charitable organizations throughout the league's footprint. Thousands of children received free tickets to games and were able to interact with players during meet-and-greet sessions. Another facet of the Grant Program were Chalktalk Seminars geared toward Senior Citizens in local communities ... The conference continued to embrace new media initiatives that help in expanding its fan base by launching a *Twitter* page (twitter.com/NECsports) in March and a *Facebook* page in June ... The popular *NEC YouTube* page (youtube.com/NECsports) gained traction this past year with nearly 16,000 video views since its launch ... For the first time, the NEC produced "NEC Notebooks" for football, men's basketball and women's basketball. The 60 second segments were made available to all institutions for use during their radio/internet broadcasts and archived on the NEC's website. The men's basketball notebook aired on *1050 ESPN Radio - The Sports Talk of New York* - over a 13-week span from December to March. Through its partnership with the station, the NEC also sponsored "SportsCenter" segments throughout the season to help promote its package of games on MSG Network ... Near TV-quality webcasts marked the league's partnership with the PackNetwork, which for the second year in a row produced live broadcasts of NEC Championships in women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, softball and baseball ... *NEC on the Run* podcasts allowed fans to follow the league's latest news via automatic downloads to their iPod or portable media player. Podcasts ran from 8-12 minutes in length and were hosted by longtime announcer Paul Dottino ... *NEC Countdown To Tipoff* preview show was available on the NEC website for the fourth straight year ... The NEC website will undergo a site redesign over the summer ... The NEC inked a two-year agreement with RoadRunner Sports, designating the company as the league's "Official Running Store." RRS served as the presenting sponsor of the NEC Cross Country, Indoor Track & Field and Outdoor Track & Field Championships. The conference also signed a three-year deal designating Adidas as its official soccer ball, marking the NEC's first-ever partnership with the nation's second largest sporting goods manufacturer ... NEC corporate partners from the past season included Akademia, Choice Hotels International, Esurance, Hershey Entertainment & Resorts, The New York Times and RoadRunner Sports. Additional basketball tournament sponsors included Anaconda Sports and Dick's Sporting Goods ... NEC-produced Fan Guides and TV schedule magnets were once again provided to all institutions for on-campus distribution ... The NEC served as an official sponsor of the Legends Classic College Basketball Tournament for the second straight year. Fairleigh Dickinson became the first NEC school to participate in the event, which culminated at the Prudential Center in Newark, NJ last November. The league received on-court signage and other promotional considerations, and appeared in print and television ads promoting the event ... The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) sought to strengthen ties with the Cancer Recovery Foundation by voting to officially establish a partnership with the organization. The SAAC made its annual visit to the foundation in Hershey, PA in February ... Other local community initiatives as reported by SAAC include: MSM's SAAC hosted a Girl Scout Day with local troops, QU's SAAC sold t-shirts for "Pink Out" to support breast cancer research and planned an event to benefit the Make-a-Wish at a hockey game, SFNY hosted a "Think Pink Day" at a basketball game, SFPA SAAC sponsored a "Think Pink" event at a basketball game and auctioned off the pink jerseys after the game, and WC SAAC hosted a blood drive. SAAC also conducted a "Sports For Kids Day," at which local children were able to interact with student-athletes ... The NEC implemented a new Team Sportsmanship Award program to recognize those teams and student-athletes who adhere to the principles of sportsmanship and pursue victory with honor. Awards are voted on by student-athletes and coaches following the conclusion of each athletic season. Saint Francis (PA) finished with a league-high six sportsmanship awards, following by Monmouth and Quinnipiac with four apiece. The NEC continued to run Public Service Announcements on the importance of sportsmanship during league telecasts and webcasts. Sportsmanship posters created by the conference remained visible in Athletic Departments and athletic venues at each institution ... The NEC had seven sports finish in the top half of all Division I Conferences in Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores, including men's tennis (7th out of 31 leagues), women's bowling (2nd/8), baseball (11th/31), softball (11th/31), women's soccer (13th/31), men's outdoor track (14th/31) and women's outdoor track (15th/31) ... A total of 19 NEC teams from among more than 700 across the nation were honored by the NCAA with public recognition awards for their latest APR scores ... NEC institutions again ranked among the nation's elite in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figures released by the NCAA. According to the NCAA data, NEC student-athletes graduated at an 83.8 percent rate, easily surpassing the national average of 78 percent. The GSR for women student-athletes was 91.4 percent, while the GSR for men student-athletes was 74.5 percent ... A total of 2,006 student-athletes were named to the NEC Academic Honor Roll this past year (GPAs of 3.20 or higher), a 24.8 percent increase from the previous year ... Five NEC student-athletes earned *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District honors, while the Conference selected Scholar-Athletes in 22 sports ... A total of 13 NEC student-athletes were named All-Americans in their respective sports ... Five teams were ranked in national polls, including FDU women's bowling (second), SHU women's bowling (sixth), Kutztown women's bowling (eighth), SFNY women's bowling (19th) and Lock Haven field hockey (22nd) ... Three school's won at least three consecutive NEC Championships, including Quinnipiac men's and women's cross country, Long Island volleyball and Lock Haven field hockey ... NEC televised 26 basketball games and three football games. Current partners include MSG, MSG Plus (formerly FSN-NY), FSN-Pittsburgh, Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN), Cox Cable (CT/RI), NESN and Connecticut Sports Network (CTSN). Fox College Sports, a national carrier, broadcasts nearly every game that appears on the MSG package. ESPN2 carried the women's basketball championship game for the second straight year. Ratings on the NEC men's basketball title game on ESPN2 were the highest in years, tripling from start to finish and watched in nearly 600,000 households. Five announcers - Paul Dottino, Dave Popkin, Tim Capstraw, Terry O'Connor and Pam Roecker - have been with the NEC for at least seven years.

NEC History

2009-10: Sacred Heart captured its third straight Brenda Weare Commissioner's Cup. The Pioneers also claimed a fourth straight Joan Martin Women's Commissioner's Cup. The Men's Cup was won by Monmouth for the eighth time in the last nine years. ... Fairleigh Dickinson won the NCAA Women's Bowling championship with a thrilling 4-3 win over Nebraska in the title match. The championship was historical in nature as it marked the first such title for a Northeast Conference institution in a league-sponsored sport. The Knights had previously won the NCAA crown in 2006 and reached the NCAA semifinals a year ago. Two members of the FDU team - Sara Litteral and Erica Perez - were named All-Americans by the National Tenpin Coaches Association. For Perez, it marked her fourth consecutive honor, while Litteral was recognized for the second straight year. ... In just its second year sponsoring the sport, the Northeast Conference featured six teams ranked in the top-15 of the National Tenpin Coaches Association (NTCA) poll during the 2009-10 campaign. In addition to NCAA champion Fairleigh Dickinson (reached third), Adelphi (seventh), New Jersey City (eighth), Sacred Heart (ninth), Kutztown (ninth) and St. Francis (NY) (10th) and were also ranked. ... The Northeast Conference continued to excel on a national stage in men's soccer. After winning its fifth consecutive regular season crown, Monmouth went on to capture the NEC Tournament title and earned the opportunity to host #12 UConn on the Great Lawn in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Before a sellout crowd, the Hawks advanced past the Huskies in penalty kicks. The Hawks finished the season ranked 13th nationally in the final NSCAA/adidas poll. ... Monmouth senior attacker Ryan Kinne was named a first team NSCAA/adidas All-American in men's soccer, while his teammate, senior defender Daniel Bostock, was tabbed to the second team. ... Long Island softball completed an unprecedented season on the diamond by becoming the first team in NEC history to reach an NCAA Regional final in the sport. The Blackbirds defeated #21 UMass and Boston University before falling to #13 Arizona State. LIU, which has won seven NEC championships this decade, featured the powerful one-two combo of NEC Player of the Year Bianca Mejia and three-time NEC Pitcher of the Year Blaire Porter. ... Central Connecticut State won its first NEC football crown since 2005 and represented the Conference in the fourth Gridiron Classic. The Blue Devils had a chance to win on the final possession but came up short in a 28-23 setback to Butler. CCSU's James Mallory, who had 109 yards in the contest, was named a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, presented annually to the outstanding player at the FCS level. Mallory was also tabbed to the Associated Press and AFCA All-American teams. ... Long Island's Selma Babic became the first player in the NEC women's tennis history to qualify for the NCAA Singles Tournament. With a 19-1 record, Babic qualified after she finished the season ranked #121 by the ITA. She also helped lead the Blackbirds to a second straight NEC championship and date with Duke in the NCAA Tournament. ... Sacred Heart senior lacrosse player Chelsea Wagner closed out a stellar career by leading the nation in save percentage (.577). She also ranked in the top-10 in GAA and saves per game. Wagner was named the inaugural NEC Goalkeeper of the Year after leading the Pioneers to their third straight NEC title. ... In its first season of competition, NEC newcomer Bryant ran away with the baseball regular season title. The Bulldogs, who finished five games ahead of the pack with a 25-7 mark, won three major awards including Brent Almeida being recognized as NEC Pitcher of the Year. ... CCSU senior Sean Allaire was tabbed NEC Baseball Player of the Year and was named a third team ABCA & Louisville Slugger All-American. In one of the great campaigns in league history, he led the NEC in batting average, runs and hits, and was second in five other categories. ... Robert Morris became the first Northeast Conference men's basketball program to repeat as champion since the mid-90s with a 52-50 win over Quinnipiac before a captivated nationwide audience and the largest crowd in NEC playoff history at the TD Bank Sports Center. It marked the seventh conference championship for the Colonials, a league record. RMU's 73 wins the last three seasons is the most over a three-year stretch in league history. ... The Robert Morris men's basketball team also became a household name this past March with a near upset of #2 seed Villanova in Providence, RI. Behind the scintillating shooting of NEC Rookie of the Year Karon Abraham, the Colonials led for much of the contest before ultimately succumbing in overtime, 73-70. ... It was a strong start for Northeast Conference men's lacrosse with a number of highlights from the inaugural season. Mount St. Mary's advanced to the NCAA Tournament after capturing the MAAC Championship. Bryant claimed the biggest win of the season with a 9-7 conquest of #9 Yale in April and Robert Morris reached as high as #19 in the USILA national poll. ... Monmouth opened its new state-of-the-art Multipurpose Activity Center (MAC) last November with a 99-70 win over FIU with nearly 3,500 fans in attendance. ... The Long Island women's volleyball program continued its dominance with a sixth straight Northeast Conference championship last fall. It marks the longest active title streak in the conference in any sport. ... Fairleigh Dickinson junior golfer Robert Cerabone qualified for the NCAA Championships after capturing the NEC individual title. He was automatically placed into the NCAA regional field following a one-stroke victory at the league meet in May. ... Saint Francis (PA) won its 10th Northeast Conference women's basketball crown with a 77-68 triumph over Long Island at the WRAC in Brooklyn, NY. Seeded fifth, the Red Flash beat the #1, #2 and #4 seeds to become the lowest seed in league history to win the championship. ... With three finishers in the top-seven, Central Connecticut State captured its first Northeast Conference championship at Quinnipiac University in Hamden, CT. ... Quinnipiac dominated the field to earn its fifth consecutive Northeast Conference cross country title on its home course in Hamden, CT. The Bobcats placed five finishers among the top-11 at the event. ... Lock Haven scored twice in the final 20 minutes of play to beat Monmouth, 2-0, and earn its fourth straight Northeast Conference field hockey title. ... Saint Francis (PA) beat two-time defending champion Sacred Heart by a single stroke to win the Northeast Conference Men's Golf championship at ChampionsGate Golf Club in ChampionsGate, FL. ... Fairleigh Dickinson made it three straight Northeast Conference women's golf titles with a three-stroke victory at the 2010 championship event at ChampionsGate Golf Club in ChampionsGate, FL. ... Long Island won its first-ever Northeast Conference men's indoor track and field championship at the P.G. County Sports Complex in Landover, MD. The Blackbirds also won their fifth NEC women's indoor title. ... Sacred Heart walked away with its third consecutive Northeast Conference women's lacrosse title with a 12-7 win over in-state rival Quinnipiac in Fairfield, CT. ... The Northeast Conference wrapped up a successful first season of men's lacrosse sponsorship in 2010. The six-team alignment consists of Bryant, Mount St. Mary's, Quinnipiac, Robert Morris, Sacred Heart and Wagner. ... Monmouth won its sixth Northeast Conference men's outdoor track crown in the last seven years with another dominating performance. The Monmouth women made it back-to-back NEC women's outdoor track and field championships with a decisive victory over Long Island. ... Monmouth won its second NEC women's soccer championship in three years and fourth overall with a 1-0 overtime win over top-seeded Central Connecticut State in New Britain, CT. ... Saint Francis (PA) took home its first Northeast Conference Women's Swimming & Diving championship, ending CCSU's two-year reign. ... Quinnipiac, seeded third, won its first Northeast Conference men's tennis championship since 2006 and fourth overall with a 4-3 win over top-seeded Sacred Heart in the title match in West Windsor, NJ. ... Long Island celebrated back-to-back Northeast Conference women's tennis titles following a 4-2 victory over top-seeded Fairleigh Dickinson in West Windsor, NJ. The Blackbirds, who were seeded second, had defeated longtime rival Quinnipiac in the semifinals. ... A trio of former Northeast Conference stars reached the pinnacle of their respective professional sports this past year. Former Monmouth standout and current Dallas Cowboys wide receiver Miles Austin was named to the NEC Pro Bowl squad. Andrew Bailey, who pitched at Wagner, was selected as the American League Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the A.L. All-Star team. Christie Rampono, a Monmouth alum, took over as player coach of the Sky Blue of the Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) league and led a struggling team to the championship. She was subsequently named WPS Sports woman of the Year. ... Northeast Conference sports that finished in the top half of all Division I Conferences in Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores were baseball (7th out of 30 leagues), men's tennis (8th/30), softball (8th/29), women's bowling (1st/3), women's soccer (10th/30), men's outdoor track (11th/30), men's indoor track (10th/27), women's tennis (12th/31), men's cross country (14th/31) and women's volleyball (14th/31). ... A total of 19 Northeast Conference teams from among more than 800 across the nation were honored by the NCAA with public recognition awards for their latest Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores. These teams posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. The 19 teams represent seven NEC schools: Fairleigh Dickinson University (women's bowling, women's golf), Long Island University (women's tennis, women's indoor track, women's outdoor track), Monmouth University (men's tennis, women's basketball, women's golf and women's tennis), Mount St. Mary's University (baseball, men's tennis and women's tennis), Quinnipiac University (baseball and women's basketball), Sacred Heart University (men's volleyball, women's rowing) and St. Francis College (NY) (men's cross country, women's golf and women's water polo). ... Northeast Conference institutions again ranked among the nation's elite in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figures recently released by the NCAA. According to the NCAA data, NEC student-athletes graduated at an 84.7 percent rate, easily surpassing the national average of 79 percent. The GSR for NEC women's student-athletes was 91.5 percent, well ahead of the national average which reached 88 percent. The men's GSR for the conference was 76.5 percent, outpacing the 71 percent nationwide rate for male student-athletes. Likewise, 60 NEC teams achieved a perfect 100 percent GSR in their respective sports during the 1999-02 time frame and half the teams earned a GSR of over 90 percent. ... During the course of the 2009-10 academic year, a record 2,258 student-athletes earned their way onto the Academic Honor Roll. That figure represents more than half of the league's competitors and stands as a 12.6-percent increase from one year ago. Likewise, 496 student-athletes were tabbed to the Commissioner's Honor Roll in 2009-10, an all-time high for the league and a year-to-year increase of 14.8 percent. ... As part of its enhanced partnership with the Cancer Recovery Foundation, the NECSAAC coordinated a leaguewide "Penny Wars" fundraiser that resulted in a \$2,800 donation to the organization. ... The Sacred Heart SAAC received the 2010 NCAA SAAC Award of Excellence. The honor is bestowed to a SAAC program that displays special and unique community service work completed by student-athletes at Division I schools. The SAAC was recognized for its work through the MOTIVATE project at the Dunbar School in Bridgeport. ... NEC field hockey programs participated in a Be the Match Challenge, which helped facilitate matches for potential bone marrow donors. The drive resulted in more than 650 people signing up for the national Be the Match Registry. The Conference office is planning to provide additional support for this event next year. ... NEC women's volleyball teams supported "Dig Pink" for the first time on a leaguewide basis this season, while women's basketball teams also participated in a number of national events this year, including the WBCA's "Pink Zone" promotion and the NCAA's "Pack the House Challenge." ... The NEC welcomed the class of 2013 to campus last summer, the first step in a new outreach program developed as a by-product of the Strategic Plan. Over 10,000 freshmen students across the Conference were provided with NEC/Akadema co-branded drawing bags at orientation sessions in August. Among the contents in the bag were promotional products and coupons donated by a number of the league's corporate partners and contributing sponsors. ... The inaugural NEC Rivalry Week featured six pairs of men's and women's basketball rivals squaring off in home-and-home contests. The innovative concept of playing back-to-back games against a local rival in a 48-hour span is the only one of its kind among the nation's 31 NCAA Division I conferences. To promote Rivalry Week, there were four games televised and two games webcast, along with special NEC Notebooks, an NEC on the Run podcast and a Sporting News Today insert dedicated to the event. ... For a third straight year, the NEC sponsored the Legends Classic, one of the country's premier early season men's basketball tournaments. The NEC received exposure through all print and web advertising for the event, as well as court decals and public address announcements at all tournament sites. The NEC also received prominent exposure during this year's championship round, which was held at Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, NJ, with all games televised live on HDNet. ... The NEC participated in the NCAA's Respect Campaign, which included co-branded NEC/NCAA banners, logos and print ads, along with public address announcements and personalized spots that ran during institutional radio and webcasts. ... Bryant, Monmouth and Saint Francis (PA) each finished the 2009-10 academic year with a league-high four sportsmanship awards. There were ten different NEC institutions or associate members with at least one team honored for their commitment to sportsmanship. ... A satellite website, www.northeastconference.tv, was launched last fall. The site serves as the league's webcast hub and offers an event archive dating back two years. A women's basketball regular season package along with eight conference championships (men's and women's soccer, field hockey, volleyball, women's basketball, women's lacrosse, softball and baseball) made up the 2009-10 webcast package. The package will expand to include women's bowling and men's lacrosse in 2010-11. ... The Conference unveiled its new promotional spot in October during league football telecasts. The 60-second spot, featuring moving panoramas, highlights each member institution. A new basketball spot debuted in December. ... The NEC offered NEC on the Run football and basketball podcasts for the third straight year. Podcasts ran from 8-12 minutes in length and were hosted by longtime announcer Paul Dottino. The podcasts were also made available to download for free on iTunes. ... The NEC partnered with Sports Radio 66 WFAN in New York City and ESPN Radio 1250 in Pittsburgh to broadcast 60-second NEC Notebook spots throughout the 2009-10 basketball season. Weekly NEC Notebooks for football and basketball were also provided to the membership for use on radio broadcasts. ... The NEC's Facebook, Twitter and YouTube following grew steadily. The Conference began setting up Twitter pages for all its championships beginning this spring and began video blogging. ... The NEC Countdown To Tipoff preview show was available for viewing on the NEC website for the fifth straight year. Behind the scenes footage during the day-long shoot was also posted on the conference YouTube page. ... The NEC received advertising and editorial considerations through an agreement with the Sporting News Today, the country's only daily digital sports newspaper. Among the highlights were interviews with SHU's Corey Hassan and RMU's Mike Rice, an NEC Dish column and full page ads promoting the league's TV package, NEC Rivalry Week and postseason tournament.
